

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The Maasai Creed

A beautiful example of a creed is the Maasai Creed. It was written around 1960 by the Congregation of the Holy Ghost ("Spiritans") in East Nigeria. It is designed on a threefold pattern of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

We believe in the one High God, who out of love created the beautiful world and everything good in it.

God created man and woman and wanted them to be happy in the world. God loves the world and every nation and tribe on the Earth.

We have known this High God in darkness, and now we know God in the light.

God promised in the book of His word, the Bible, that God would save the world and all the nations and tribes.

We believe that God made good God's promise by sending the Son, Jesus Christ, a man in the flesh, a Jew by tribe, born poor in a little village, who left his home and was always on safari doing good, curing people by the power of God, teaching about God and humans, showing the meaning of religion is love.

He was rejected by his people, tortured and nailed hands and feet to a cross and died.

He lay buried in the grave, but the hyenas did not touch him, and on the third day, he rose from the grave. He ascended to the skies. He is the Lord.

We believe that all our sins are forgiven through him.

All who have faith in him must be sorry for their sins, be baptized in the Holy Spirit of God, live the rules of love and share the bread together in love, to announce the Good News to others until Jesus comes again. We are waiting for him. He is alive. He lives. This we believe. Amen.
