- L: This is the good news: Christ is coming and blessed are those who wait on the Lord.
- C: Therefore, come quickly, Lord. Amen.

Affirmation of Baptism

- L: We begin by making the sign that was made on the day of our baptisms. We gather in the name of the Father, and of the Son + and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- L: As we see the light the Christ candle, we remember the words that were said when we were baptized:
- C: Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.
- L: Brothers and sisters, in Baptism, God brings us into his family and calls us his own. By Baptism, God gives us the gifts of faith, love, life, forgiveness, and strength, and asks to respond in faithfulness to him and in service to others.

I ask those who are affirming their baptisms today, do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism:

- to live among God's faithful people;
- to hear his Word and share in his supper;
- to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,
- to serve all people, following the example of our Lord Jesus,
- and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth.
- C: I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.
- L: Let us pray. We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit, you give us new birth, cleanse us from sin, and raise us to eternal life. Stir up in your people the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.




