



L: You tell us:

Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. So, make our hearts pure with us that we might know Your love all the more. Lord in your mercy, **hear our prayer.** 

L: You tell us:

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called the children of God. So we pray for all who work for peace: peace in relationships; peace in communities; peace in politics; peace in places of conflict; peace for the body, mind and soul ... that all might see themselves and others as God's children.

Lord of all peace, our nation becomes more divided every week. Anger, frustration, disappointment, suspicion, and distrust have eroded relationships and perpetuated a mentality of "us and them," so that the real issues are eclipsed and the real people who are hurting are forgotten once again. By the power of your Holy Spirit, we pray for the deep healing that must happen — *no more band-aids* — and we pray for ourselves who are called to do the difficult work of rebuilding trust and creating communities that resemble your kingdom of heaven. We pray for our nation, especially on Tuesday; we give thanks for the freedoms of our country as we exercise our right to vote and we pray for the safety and security of our election. Lord in your mercy, **hear our prayer.** 

L: You tell us:

So, we pray for the broken and despised, the marginalized and the downtrodden, the victims and the dispossessed, the refugees and the homeless . . . this kingdom, our precious kingdom, belongs also to them.
