Daring to Hope Again

Welcome

L: Each of us has choices about how we will respond to events in our lives that cause us grief. We can become hard, bitter, and angry. Another alternative for us is to allow difficulties to open us to God's healing in new ways. Through God's healing, we can grow deeper in our faith and our trust.

If we allow our hearts to become hardened to God's healing, we put ourselves on the casualty list. When we choose trust and faith over fear and doubt, we will find hope that will carry us through.

We pray this worship service will be an opportunity for you to make yourself available to experience the life-giving presence of Jesus. Allow yourself to see his face covered with tears and feel the brokenness of his heart as he sat with those who were filled with dark despair. Allow Jesus to meet you with his healing love, so that you might find resurrection in your life and experience the power of hope again.

L: Blessed be God eternal, watching over all we do.
Blessed be Jesus, our wisdom and companion in the striving.

Gather

- L: When darkness fills our lives, we wonder, "Where are you, Jesus? Do you even care about us?"
- C: Jesus is doing the same thing today as on the day he went to the tomb of his friend Lazarus—weeping for us and drying our tears.
- L: We feel lost and alone. Sometimes we feel like we don't know who we are.
- C: When we remember the suffering Christ and the despair and sorrow of his friends and followers, we know that we are not alone. Many have walked this way before.
- L: It has seemed unbearable at times to endure our losses and experience our pain.
- C: Christ assures us that he is patiently waiting with us as we endure distress. Our trials are not overwhelming to him.
- L: Thanks be to God and to our suffering servant Jesus Christ.
- C: We open ourselves to you now, so you may create life out of death, carve hope out of despair, and restore our wholeness. Amen.

L: God of hope and new life, help us to celebrate the joy of abundant life as you intend for us. Through your great love, let all who need you now, feel your presence and know your peace, as shown through your Son, Jesus Christ, who taught us to pray:

P: Our Father, who art in heaven,

hallowed be thy name;

thy kingdom come;

thy will be done;

on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses,

as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation;

but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever.
